Unmanned Aircraft Systems Sept. 2016

Amendment to Chapter 20, Parks Recreation and Cultural Affairs and Chapter 21 McDowell Sonoran Preserve of the Scottsdale Revised Code

Background

- State of Arizona 2016 legislation session approved Senate Bill 1449 which outlines how a city, town or county can enact or adopt ordinances or rules that regulate the model aircraft.
- It does allow for prohibiting take off/landings on public parks/preserves if other areas in the city available for this use.

Delete from both Parks and Preserve Ordinance

- Current language- Parks Ordinance Chapter 20 Article 111 Section 20-31 subsection (b)(16)
 - Gas powered model airplanes and incendiary model rockets are prohibited.
- Amended language-
 - · Incendiary model rockets are prohibited
- Current language- Preserve Ordinance Chapter 21 Article 111
 Section 21-12 subsection (b)(22)
 - Gas powered model airplanes and incendiary model rockets are prohibited in the preserve.
- Amended language-
 - Incendiary model rockets are prohibited. The regulation of model aircraft in the preserve is governed by Chapter 20, Article IX of the Scottsdale Revised Code.

Addition of Article in Chapter 20

- Model Aircraft Operation in City Parks and Preserve
 - · Provides definitions
 - Prohibited Operations
 - No person shall operate a model aircraft to takeoff or land in a city park or the Preserve where the director has prohibited such operations. The director may prohibit such operation in certain parks and the preserve provided there is at least one other park or preserve within the city that is available for model aircraft operation. The list of prohibited locations shall be on file with the city clerk

Prohibited Locations (Sept. 2016)

- McDowell Sonoran Preserve
- Pinnacle Peak Park and Trailhead
- Mescal Park
- Stonegate Park

Exceptions

- This prohibited operation does not apply to city police personnel or other law enforcement officers, fire department personal and other city employees in the course of their official duties.
- Others authorized by the city for inspection, repair, maintenance work or other city related business with authorized by the director.

Penalties

- First violation is a petty offense (\$50-\$300)
- Second or subsequent within one year is a class two misdemeanor (not less than \$300)
