WHAT IS AN AIRPORT MASTER PLAN?

- Planning document required by the FAA that facilitates development at the airport (per Advisory Circular 150/5070-6B, Airport Master Plans).
- Comprehensive study of the airport that evaluates the facility's aviation demand.
- Provides for short, intermediate, and long term planning horizons that encompass a 20-year planning period.
- Serves as a strategic tool for establishing airport improvement priorities and obtaining funding.



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
AIRPORT CLASSIFICATION

- Historical aircraft activity supports RDC D-III designation
- Environmental Assessment proposed strengthening of runway and associated taxiways to 100,000 pounds DWL
- The Aviation Department and the FAA have determined that increasing the pavement strength up to 100,000 pounds DWL would require the airport to meet D-III standards
- Master Plan not practicable to meet D-III standards


Moving Forward

- RDC D-II designation
- Pavement strength to remain at 75,000 pounds DWL
- PPR remains effective (which will allow 100,000 pound aircraft to still operate)
- Pursuit of Modification to Design Standards








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
SIGNIFICANT DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS



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CIP DEVELOPMENT STAGING - SHORT TERM PROGRAM



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HIGHLIGHTS

Total Economic Benefits of Scottsdale Airport/Airpark

- Aviation activity at the Airport and in the Airpark created \$536 million total economic benefits for the region in FY 2014
- Aviation activity supported 3,462 jobs with incomes of \$186.2 million
- Catalytic (spin-off) non-aviation activity added benefits of \$8.2 billion

Economic Benefits on the Airport

- The 61 private employers on the Airport had revenues of \$134 million
- There are 588 aviation jobs on the Airport with incomes of \$40 million

Economic Benefits on the Airpark

- The 104 aviation-related Airpark firms reported revenues of \$150 million
- The 818 aviation-related jobs on the Airpark create incomes of \$49 million

Air Visitors to Scottsdale Airport

- Visitors arriving at Scottsdale Airport spent \$43.9 million off the Airport
- On an average day, air visitors inject \$120,000 into the area economy
