# PARKING ORDINANCE CITY OF SCOTTSDALE

- 1. Parking and driveway area shall not exceed 35% of the required front yard area. It must be (contiguous). Parcels or lots zoned for lot sizes in excess of thirty five thousand---35.000-sq. feet shall be exempt from the screening requirements set forth in this section.
- 2. All vehicles parking shall be on a designated, improved surface (defined in a prior ordinance.)
- 3. Vehicles must be two (2) feet from the sidewalk or curb and one (1) foot from the entire property side lot line.
- 4. A recreational vehicle is a general term for a vehicle bearing current license and or registration which includes the following camper trailer, travel trailer, truck camper, motor home, boat trailer, horse trailer, utility trailer, and boat.
- 5. a.) Recreational vehicles shall not be parked in the designated front yard.
  - b.) Recreational vehicles in the side yard should have a one (1) foot set back from the side property line and the RV should be screened by a six foot wall or solid fence or gate.
  - c.) Recreational vehicles may be parked in the (backyard) with required setbacks provided herein.
- 6. Parking of recreational vehicles may be in an enclosed, permanent structure, within the buildable area.
- 7. The vehicle shall not be used for living quarters or business purposes. A commercial vehicle that is used for work (as plumbing, electrical, landscaping if used five (5) days a weeks and brought home every night) may be parked in the driveway. Vehicles having a gross weigh rating (GVWR) exceeding ten thousand (10,000) pounds or having dual rear wheels exceeding seventeen inches (17") and a one-ton chassis must not be parked in a residential lot.
- 9. Temporary parking of RV's on the public street subject to city parking and traffic regulations or driveway, is allowed to the maximum of seventy two(72) consecutive hours to allow for leading and unloading (n0ot more often then twice in any seven consecutive day period). Occurrences must be separated by at least thirty (30) (days).
- 10. The regulations contained within this chapter are not intended to supersede any lawfully established, covenants, conditions and restrictions relating to the parking of recreational vehicles and utility trailers nor shall the granting of any special permit supersede any lawful Homeowners Association applicable to the subject property.

The Parking Ordinance will take effect (1) year from the time of a City Council approval. Public notices to violators can originate from citzens or city employee observations. Code Enforcement shall have two business days to physically inspect the property.

- 11. The parking ordinance will take effect one (1) year from the date of City Council approval.
- 12. Public notices to violators can originate from citizens or city employee observations. Code Enforcement shall have two (2) business days to physically inspect the property.

2001 the City amended an ordinance to provide commercial storage areas to accommodate these vehicles with C-3 and l-1 zoning.
