Funding Process Key Dates

- □ Proposals were due November 5, 2021.
- Responses to Human Services Staff Evaluation were due <u>December 17, 2021</u>.
- □ CDBG, and General Funds video presentations with Commissioners Q&A (Applicants will be available) will be viewed on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>February 10</u>, <u>2022</u>.
- Scottsdale Cares and Endowment video presentations with Commissions Q& A (applicants will be available) will be viewed on Thursday, February 24, 2022.
- ☐ Funding Scoring Sheet Submissions due to CAO by 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday March 3, 2021 (no meeting).

Administrative

- Each agency will be limited to submitting 1 electronic proposal per funding source.
 - Will be verified through the agency's Tax ID Number.
 - ☐ Scottsdale Cares agencies will not receive more than 15% of the total funding amount available.
 - ☐ General Fund agencies will not receive more than 20% of the total funding amount available.



Administrative (Scoring)

- Any Agency failing to submit a video presentation or does not virtually attend the Commissioner's Q&A session will receive <u>0 points</u> for presentation.
- Any Agency failing to respond to the Human Services Staff Evaluation or submitted their response after the December deadline received a 10 point reduction.
- Any Agency that fails to submit a video presentation, does not virtually attend the Commissioner's Q&A session and did not submit a response to the Human Services Staff Evaluation will be <u>disqualified</u> from the funding process.



Human Services Staff Evaluation

- Proposals have been reviewed by City Staff to determine general eligibility and completion.
- Staff has analyzed the content of each application and compiled clarifying inquiries, if warranted.
- Finalized Staff Evaluations were emailed to each agency.
 - Responses were required by December 17, 2021.
 - Responses are included in the funding proposal documents prepared for the review and scoring.

Determine if the proposal clearly identifies partnerships or collaborations.

WHERE TO FIND THIS INFORMATION IN THE PROPOSAL: PROGRAM RELATED INFORMATION, PAGE 2.

Evaluation Tool Guidelines

- Identifies criteria for scoring sections of the proposals
- Distinguishes where information can be referenced in the proposal



CDBG Funds

- National Objectives
 - ☐ Projects must meet one of the following:
 - Primary Benefit to Low- and Moderate-Income Persons
 - Prevention or Removal of Slum and Blight
 - Mitigation or Elimination of a Certified Emergency Condition (e.g., major catastrophes or emergencies such as floods and earthquakes).



CDBG Funds

- Disposition (disposal of real property)

- Lead Based Paint Hazard Removal

- Program Administration

Available Funds vs Requested Funds

CDBG Public Services

- ■Anticipated available funding approximately \$167,734
- ■Set Aside Public Services-Crime Prevention \$48,765
- Nine proposals received totaling \$738,912
- □ Deficit of \$571,178
- □CDBG Non-Public Services Housing Rehabilitation & Public Facility
- ■Anticipated available funding approximately \$726,847
- □ Housing Rehabilitation programs set-aside \$276,847
- □Roads- set-aside \$450,000



Scottsdale Cares

Eligible Activities

- Promote the positive development of youth, adults and seniors
- Strengthen the capability of families and the selfsufficiency of adults
- Assist Scottsdale residents of all ages to address crisis needs



Available Funds vs Requested Funds

- Anticipated available funding approximately \$150,000

- □Eleven proposals received totaling \$487,493
- □ Deficit of \$362,493



Endowment Funds

Fund Categories

Qualifying organizations shall be either City of Scottsdale programs or organizations that are tax exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

- ☐ The Scottsdale Community Endowment Fund is used to carry out the purposes of community projects and programs for the public good within the city
- ☐ The Herbert R. Drinkwater Youth Fund is used to support City of Scottsdale youth programs



Available Funds vs Requested Funds

 Anticipated available funding approximately \$8,600

Three proposal received totaling \$15,600

Deficit of \$7,000
