Scottsdale Pool Barrier Requirements for Short-Term Rentals

Short-term rental properties that include a swimming pool, hot tub or spa must be in compliance with Scottsdale's Barrier Requirements*. The purpose of these requirements is to ensure the safety of rental guests and prevent drownings.

These properties must have a **primary** 60" perimeter fence, unable to be easily climbed, that prevents public access (ex. a block wall that surrounds the backyard). Perimeter gates must be self-closing, self-latching with the latch placed at least 54" in height. Vehicle gates must be locked.

Additionally, the property must have a **secondary** barrier that restricts access to the pool itself. This can be **either** a separate pool fence **or** alarm system on doors and windows leading to the pool area. See the two secondary barrier options below.

or

Option 1: With pool fence


A 60" high fence, unable to be easily climbed, surrounding the pool that restricts access by occupants of the rental and their guests.

• The pool barrier gate's latch must be placed at least 54" in height and must be equipped to accommodate a locking mechanism

If a spa or hot tub is outside the pool's barrier, it must have a lockable cover.

Option 2: Without pool fence

The home itself may serve as a secondary barrier to the pool as long as all doors and windows providing direct access to the pool, hot tub or spa are equipped with audible alarms.
