## Find information about the Nov. 5 General Election at Scottsdale.Vote

The ballot features races for mayor and two City Council seats along with two propositions. Prop. 490 is a

0.15% city sales tax rate that would go into effect July 1, 2025, after a current 0.20% sales tax rate expires. Funds would be used solely to fund improvements, maintenance, and protection of city parks and recreational facilities, and maintenance and protection of the McDowell Sonoran Preserve.

Prop. 491 asks voters whether to increase the city's state-imposed expenditure limitation baseline. This would not increase or decrease any tax. The proposed change would allow the city to operate within an expenditure limitation that more closely matches existing revenue sources to meet current and planned services and programs.

The voter registration deadline for the General Election is Oct. 7; early voting begins Oct. 9.

# Specialized wells are part of a diverse water resource strategy

Scottsdale is building four Aquifer Storage and Recovery wells as part of a commitment to maximize renewable surface water supplies and minimize



using groundwater. These wells inject high quality, potable water directly into the aquifer when water demand is low (late fall and winter) and retain the capability to withdraw groundwater during high demand or emergencies.

It's like putting water in the bank. ASR wells are an essential part of Scottsdale Water's commitment to provide amenities and quality of life for residents in the future.
