Water and Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator

A treatment plant operator is a dynamic career where no two days are alike. Through this career field, candidates will learn to monitor, operate, and adjust a wide variety of systems used in the treatment of water or wastewater at each of the city's treatment plants. Candidates will ensure the plant operates efficiently by monitoring lab data, charts, and computer control systems. By the end of the 24-month performance plan, candidates will have obtained ADEQ Water Operator Certification and be qualified to start as a Grade II Operator.

Supervisory Controls and Data Acquisition (SCADA)

Our competitive, hands-on apprentice program provides 4,000 contact hours of specialized training to prepare industrial control system and information technology professionals for a meaningful and challenging career in the water industry.

Instrumentation Controls Technician

This 18-month apprentice program focuses on the commercial processes of Scottsdale Water's water and wastewater facilities. Candidates will learn how to install, maintain, and repair the measuring and control devices used within the water industry.
